



Listening for What Matters

Effective Communication

Communicating to be Heard

Express messages in a way that doesn't attack your listener and helps them to understand your concerns.

- Identify and delete any loaded language
- Identify the issues and interests (needs)
- Intention and impact
- Consider: Start with "I" (which takes responsibility for message) instead of "you" (which blames).
